The male song sparrow has been gifted by God to sing as many as 20 different melodies on any given spring morning. As evening approaches, he may have improvised as many as 900-plus variations on his basic theme. This musical gift of serenading with such variety and passion wins the heart of his mate and then courtship begins. After all their duet singing, she lays 3 to 6 eggs and incubates them for 12 to 15 days. An inspired singer as well, she gets them singing and ready to fill the world with music in about 10 days, as one by one they leave the comforts of their own recital hall. They become virtuosos like mom and dad as they make their way from one forest concert hall to another, glorifying God and bringing joy to all who are listening. The male's four-note basic theme has been described as very similar to the opening theme in Beethoven's "Fifth Symphony." Then off he goes with many, many variations sung very loudly and very clearly to keep danger far away from the growing choir under conductor mom. She conducts with a baton of love and joy and the youngsters create new compositions as they learn to be outstanding musicians. By fall, this sibling choir has matured into accomplished solo performers who continue in the same traditions of mom and dad. This is nothing short of stunning, miraculous and humbling for some of us less-talented musicians.

These calling cranes are most likely announcing, to let others know, that it is mating time. They are well-known for their "tribal war dance" or "wild courtship antics." If you are invited to this performance, you will likely tell others the next day that it was your most memorable sight ever in the avian kingdom. The eggs the female lays are incubated both by mom and pop crane. In 30 to 32 days, these sandhills become parents and look after their young for about a year. You may agree that this photo is stunning, from the long legs reflected in the pools of water to the sunset reflected in the background. God is to be praised!
